CPD training days in 2018 by IHBC aim to stimulate discussion in the 50th year since Conservation Areas were first designated in Scotland. The first to be designated, Carlops in the Scotlish Borders, is celebrated on 19 April, exactly 50 years on, combined with a preview of the CARS in Penicuik by Midlothian Council. The Ayrshire day will look at conservation area management in Ayr from soon after designation in July 1968 to the present day, as major proposals by Ayr Renaissance to develop the town centre mean radical surgery in the High Street. We will look at the <u>Conservation Area Appraisal</u> for Central Ayr, assess the impact of the recent THI, and look at strategic ways forward.

Next we will learn about neighbouring Maybole, find out about community-led proposals for enhancing its Conservation Area and discuss with consultants the ongoing preparation of its CA Management Plan.

We propose to complete the series later in the year with a day looking at Conservation Areas in Aberdeen.
