## **Why is digital archiving important?**

Changes in technology - for example the shift from chemical to digital photography - mean that ever increasing volumes of information are being stored in digital format.

The rate of change in computing technologies is such that this information can be rendered inaccessible within a decade as it is vulnerable to loss, fragmentation and obsolescence. In some cases this information can be the only record made of important discoveries. If this information is lost, then a real opportunity to understand the history and significance of a building is lost.

The digital preservation process is analogous to traditional archiving in many respects – digital files require the same continuous monitoring as fragile physical objects. The aims are also the same – to aid research and preserve important information for posterity.

**If you are worried about your digital information legacy, your photographs, files, reports, drawings and plans, and what might happen to them in the future, then this workshop is for you!**
