Dr Charles Mynors FLSW Barrister FRTPI IHBC FICFor (Hon) will be delivering the training for the day. Charles has degrees in architecture and planning and was a conservation officer in London for nine years, many years ago – he was a founder member of both the IHBC and its predecessor the ACO! He also became a Fellow of the RTPI and the RICS. He then qualified as a barrister, practising at the planning Bar for 27 years, appearing for and against planning authorities at inquiries and in court and advising on planning and heritage issues.

During that time Charles produced a stream of books – *Planning Applications and Appeals*; *Listed Buildings and Other Heritage Assets*; *The Law of Trees, Forests and Hedges*; *Control of Outdoor Advertising and Graffiti*; and *Changing Churches: A Guide to the Faculty System* – each of which has become the standard text in its field. He was Chancellor of the Diocese of Worcester for 23 years and was a visiting professor at Oxford Brookes University, lecturing on conservation law there and at the University of Bath. Since 2016, he has been working for the Law Commission on simplifying planning legislation. A third edition of *Trees* was published last year and a sixth edition of his book on *Listed Buildings* will be appearing in time for Christmas. In his spare time, Charles is trying to learn the harp.
