East Midlands IHBC Peripatetic Meeting and CPD in Lincoln, Friday 8th April 2022



We are very much looking forward to re-connecting at our Lincoln Peripatetic meeting and CPD event. This will be our first in person event since 2019 and will be an opportunity to meet new faces and share best practice looking at two of the regions most exciting heritage projects; *Lincoln Cathedral Fabric Repairs* and *Conservation of Lincoln Medieval Bishops Palace*. There will be an opportunity to see the recently opened Lincoln Cathedral Connected project, a £12.4M project for a new visitor centre, a larger café and shop, new toilets and a changing places facility, and an interpretation centre to display some of the Cathedral's treasures. The welcome, meeting, presentations and lunch will be held in the Dunlop Room of the Old Deanery Visitor Centre at Lincoln

Cathedral. These are newly refurbished rooms which are now linked to the cathedral by the new extension. The event is also available as a virtual offer and more information will follow on this via email to members.

What's happening in the region

Heritage Lincolnshire get the green light to deliver a multi-million pound Town Centre Transformation Scheme in Boston

Heritage Lincolnshire, is celebrating securing approval for a £3.9m funding boost for Boston's town centre, courtesy of the Boston Town Deal Board and the Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities

This exciting project, 'Healing the High Street: Boston', will build on Heritage Lincolnshire's successful existing Townscape Heritage grant scheme (funded by the National Heritage Lottery Fund) and will result in a substantial pot of grant funding being made available to local businesses and property owners in Boston Town Centre, including (but not limited to) the Market Place, Strait Bargate and Wide Bargate. This will focus on transforming town centre properties through grants to repair and revitalise historic buildings and shopfronts. The project will

focus on Boston's diverse and valuable historic environment, as well as newer and prominent buildings in the town centre. It is also expected that this funding will be used to leverage wider investment into the town of Boston, with the aim of substantially improving the living, working and shopping environment for residents, visitors and businesses alike.

Phase 1 works at Wingfield Station

Work has started on the transformation of Wingfield Station in Derbyshire with contractor ASBC and funding from Historic England Stimulus Fund. Wingfield Station, which was upgraded to Grade II* status In 2015 had been virtually untouched since it closed in 1967, and was on the 'at risk' register. In 2019, Amber Valley Borough Council obtained the building through compulsory purchase with Derbyshire Historic Buildings Trust with support from Historic England. Wingfield Station is an early railway station, built in 1839-40 as one of a series. of picturesque stations along the new North Midland Railway line. It is no longer in

operation as a station, having been closed in 1967, but sits alongside the fully operational Midland Main Line between Derby and Leeds. Have a look at the <u>video</u> showing the fantastic progress on site.

Heritage Lincolnshire to Explore Networks in the Midlands for Historic England – We need your help!

Heritage Lincolnshire have been commissioned by Historic England to take the pulse of the heritage sector in the Midlands to see how an effective forum for heritage can be created or reinvigorated. This will ask the sector what networks it has and needs at different levels to be as effective as it can be, including review of East and West Midlands Historic Environment Forums. We need your help to make sure we get an honest picture of how



connected the Midlands is and what you need to understand opportunities and take advantage of collaboration.
