First off the block is our New Year event Regenerating the Ouseburn Valley – 14:00-17:00 Thursday 15th February 2024

The event will be led by John Pendlebury Professor of Urban Conservation at the School of Architecture, Planning and Landscape, Newcastle University, assisted by Chris Barnard, Chair of the Ouseburn Trust.

This half-day event will focus on the ongoing regeneration of the lower Ouseburn Valley. The Ouseburn – a tributary to the River Tyne – has been a cradle of industrial development with manufacturing and residential cheek by jowl. In recent years the focus of substantial regeneration efforts, the area is being transformed by exemplary new interventions including the award-winning Seven Stories; Ouseburn City Farm; and with new housing replacing vacant sites.

We will spend the afternoon exploring the Ouseburn Valley, learning about the unique role of the Ouseburn Trust and its vision for a vibrant, diverse and sustainable future for the historic valley.

This will be followed by a walking tour and we will finish the afternoon with light refreshments and a networking event. The half day event (2-5pm) will start and finish at the Ouseburn Cycle Hub.

Join us for an in-depth, accessible exploration of this unique urban regeneration site. This first class CPD opportunity is ideally suited to conservation, planning and design professionals.
