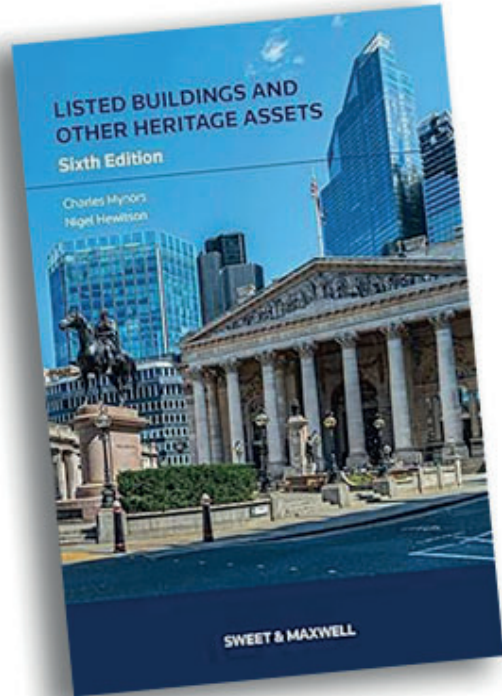


REVIEW OF HISTORIC BUILDING LEGISLATION

IHBC North Branch is pleased to announce a further summer CPD event. This time on historic building legislation and practice, with our main speaker being Dr Charles Mynors, supported by Martin Howard.

Charles Mynors has decades of experience and the 6th edition of the long established reference book on this legislation has recently been published. Charles was a conservation officer in London for nine years, and a founder member of the ACO and then the IHBC. He then practised as a planning barrister for 27 years, during which time he wrote the standard text book on the law of listed buildings, and another on the law of trees and forestry – both have ran to many subsequent editions. He was a diocesan chancellor until the pandemic, and wrote *Changing Churches*, to explain the faculty system. After a stint at the Law Commission, he now works for the Welsh Government, rewriting planning legislation. He is also Fellow of the RTPI and has been a Fellow of the RICS; a bencher of the Middle Temple; and a Fellow of the Learned Society of Wales. In his spare time he is learning to play the harp.
