# SPAB Working Party: Saving the Gable 25 - 27 June 2021 Moffat Old Churchyard, Moffat, Dumfries & Galloway Prices vary

This working party will be based in the Old Churchyard in the town of Moffat and will focus on the sole surviving gable of the prereformation 15th century parish church. SPAB Scotland plans to carry out removal of cement pointing and vegetation, consolidation and repointing of the gable and whinstone rubble boundary wall of the surrounding churchyard. £20 per day.
