IHBC Annual School 2022 in Aberdeen and Aberdeenshire

Bookings are open! <https://aberdeen2022.ihbc.org.uk/> This is an excellent opportunity to showcase building conservation in Scotland, particularly the North East, and to learn from our peers. We draw to your attention:

1. 5 Bursaries available to members of any branch that include £200 towards travel and accommodation to attendees of the whole school. These have a closing date of 31 March, that might or might not be extended.

2. IHBC Scotland Branch is offering its own bursaries for attendance at the 2022 Summer School to members of IHBC Scotland branch who are students or early in their conservation careers. This is open to all categories of membership, except the committee, and you may define what you count as early career in whichever way you wish. Deadline 19 April. We will find out if you get two bursaries!

We will cover the fees for a limited number of places at the full school and also for the day school. Applicants would need to cover their own travel and accommodation and make their own booking. If you would like to apply, please provide a short written statement (200- 500 words) telling us a bit about yourself, whether you would like support to attend the whole summer school (16-18 June) or only the day school (17 June- please specify) and how you would share your experience/learning

with others. You may also be invited to help during the school and/or the tours, or report on the tours in Context. Email your submission to scotland@ihbc.org.uk by 19 April 2022 and you will hear from us in that week, giving you time to book that month and to receive reimbursement from us if successful.

There also are options to attend online the Market Place on 15 June and the Day School on 17 June. As this will be the first annual school allowing in person attendance since 2019 we hope to see a good turnout from Scots in person. Online attendance will not be subsidised through bursaries but should be affordable in any case. If subscriptions are not paid by 1 July, membership benefits terminate automatically.
