AROUND THE CIRCUS OF DELIGHT: EXPLORING THE HISTORY OF THE MEADOWS,

EDINBURGH -A walk led by garden historian Christopher Dingwall, Vice Chairman of Scotland's Garden and Landscape Heritage and member of IHBC.

Starting on Middle Meadow Walk, we will consider the history of Edinburgh's Meadows from earliest times to the present day. Christopher will describe its origins as a hunting ground and area of woodland on the southern outskirts of the town, tracing its subsequent development as the Boroughloch supplying the town with water in the late 16th century, landscaping as a public open space and golf ground in the 18th century, location of a major International Exhibition in the late 19th century. Consideration will be go to the legal protection afforded to the Meadows as an open space, and to the impact of peripheral developments like George Square and the Quartermile redevelopment of the old Edinburgh Royal Infirmary begun in 2001.

The 1.5 hour walk will follow paths across the Meadows. No charge. Bring masks for indoors social afterwards. Book Scotland@ihbc.org.uk

3 May 12 pm. Balancing energy efficiency and conservation in the transition towards net-zero – The Canongate Housing project - Masterclass by Yann Grandgirard, Climate Change Manager at Edinburgh World Heritage.

Retrofitting Edinburgh's existing housing stock is a crucial step if the city is to become net zero by 2030. This will involve interventions in many 'hard-to-treat' properties: tenements in multiple ownership as well as historic buildings that are protected (or not) for their heritage value.

The talk will focus on the Canongate Housing Energy Efficiency and Conservation project, completed in March 2021, which aimed to create integrated solutions to these challenges and establish a repeatable delivery model for energy retrofits in these 'hard-to-treat' properties and others. Part of the Edinburgh College of Art Masterclass series, this one is sponsored by IHBC Scotland branch.

3 May online (or catch the recording later from SPAB/ PKHT; £6) **Dumfries Historic Buildings Trust** purchased the Rosefield Mills riverfront building in 2019 with the support of the community through their engagement in consultations, volunteering, and donations. The simple repair and re-use of this





former mill building will respect the rich history of the site and develop an attractive amenity. This begins an exciting journey in the creation of something special, attractive, accessible and of significant benefit to the community of Dumfries and the wider region. Luke Moloney will present the background to Rosefield Mills, and will explain the Trust's vision for breathing new life back into them.
