"On 19th April 2018 members of IHBC Scotland branch visited Penicuik and Carlops as part of a training day to celebrate fifty years of Conservation Areas in Scotland.

In Penicuik we were welcomed by Rod Lugg and Elaine Richardson of Midlothian Council with a presentation about the Penicuik Townscape Heritage and Conservation Area Regeneration Scheme. This partnership between the Heritage Lottery Fund,



Historic Environment Scotland and Midlothian Council, supported by Penicuik Community Development Trust and Penicuik First (BID), aims to enhance the historic core of the town. Rod and Elaine explained the pivotal role community engagement and opportunities for local people have played in gaining support for the scheme.

We then embarked on a tour of some of the scheme's priority projects. We stopped to admire Park End, designed by maverick gothic architect FT Pilkington. We also called in to the Penicuik Papermaking Heritage Centre, with its printing press and vintage stationery stop.

Another bus journey brought us to Carlops, where we were met by Mark Douglas and Ranald Dodds of Scottish Borders Council. Mark and Ranald provided a tour of the village. The group inspected a row of weavers' cottages, laid out in 1784, and a recently completed patio garden project at Carlops Parish Church. This has improved access and is a visually pleasing space for events opposite 'Carlins Lowp', or Witches Leap: two rock faces about 20m in height facing each other. Folklore has it that witches would leap from one to the other for entertainment of an evening!

The group retired to the Allan Ramsay Hotel to celebrate fifty years of Conservation Areas in Scotland at the very first to be designated. The Edinburgh Gazette notice for Carlops and Skirling conservation areas was published on 19 April 1968.

Thanks to those from Midlothian and Scottish Borders Councils who so generously gave of their time and knowledge and made it a very enjoyable and informative day."

Membership Application Training Event (MATE) in Glasgow:

Co-organiser and membership Secretary Sarah Kettles reported back on a well-attended afternoon event, held on 7 June at Glasgow City Heritage Trust's office's conference room. 17 affiliates attended. There was much positive feedback and a welcome strong representation of delegates from HES. The committee thanks all involved in making it happen, especially Kate Kendall (IHBC Learning, Education, Training & Standards officer) who facilitated the event. One attendee noted there was absolutely nothing to hold him back from making an application for full membership of IHBC, now having a better understanding of how and where to start. Useful tips included: demonstrating CPD in practice; being reflective on past projects; having perspective on the particular 'areas of competence' related to the candidate's experience; as well as highlighting dos and don'ts along the way. Five full Members from Scotland Branch assisted at the event, and together with the facilitator helped identify candidates' personal strengths as well as imparting procedural guidance. We soon hope to repeat the event in Scotland.

IHBC SCOTLAND NEWS

Online branch members' survey: Our Education Training & Standards officer and moderator of the survey Zinnie Denby-Mann has compiled results from your feedback. The branch will use this very worthwhile info to help develop its annual CPD programme. Thanks to those who took part in the anonymously conducted



survey. In summary:

- Half of respondents were affiliates, who would expect to get most from CPD.
- Geographical coverage: Inverness to Dumfriesshire. Someone asked for less central-belt centric activity
- Location of events: first choice was Edinburgh (49%), followed by Glasgow 29% and Stirling 23%, then Dundee, Aberdeen and Perth.
- Timing: weekdays (67%) and during the day (51%) is favoured.
- Type of event: visits came to the top (45%) followed by hands on practical skills, economics, new design, conservation philosophy and legislation. Some other good ideas came forward.
- Evening events are for networking, visits and lectures
- Purpose: to gain work-related knowledge/skills was well to the fore (67%)

IHBC Council+ 2018 at Peterborough: Zinnie Denby-Mann represented our branch, with members Tom Hunter (conferring remotely - he has left Orkney for the Netherlands) and Kevin Toner to report back on the proceedings. 'Reverse mentoring' was the theme hoping to glean direction from early career members (canvassed from across the UK). Candidates were grouped with senior peers into teams of mentors and mentees and an arbitrator. Six groups shared thoughts and concerns with a view to informing the institute's support for conservation professionals, with lots of feedback, fresh perspectives and recommendations. The findings are to be distributed to delegates and the membership as a whole. A taster video was released in the interim on You Tube. Further details.... Younger delegates in return gained an insight into the governance of the IHBC.


