IHBC Scotland Branch AGM & Conference: Design at the Water's Edge, 29 November 2018 in Dundee. Members were emailed the latest notice and agenda for the AGM. This is your chance to consider joining the committee and/or to gain some excellent CPD!

Now that Dundee is a designated UNESCO City of Design what has changed down by the waterfront? Not only the new and iconic V&A, but how has the historic environment influenced layouts, and how are old dockland buildings incorporated, based on a pioneer conservation plan and subsequent masterplan? In DCA we will discuss the role of Design Panels and of Design Awards. Does one lead straight to the other, or are there tweaks to be done in between by our members?

50 years of Conservation Areas in Scotland: Conservation Area Management study day in South Ayrshire. Following on from Carlops and Penicuik Conservation Areas in April, reported in issue 12, we report on our branch CPD day at Ayr and Maybole. Carlops and Skirling were joint first in Scotland; then Ayr No 1 followed in 1969.

"IHBC Scotland branch held the second of its study days on Conservation Areas in Ayrshire on 11 May, hosted and addressed by Neil Feggans, South Ayrshire Council. In Ayr's County buildings we heard presentations about early days in managing conservation there by Charles Strang -installed soon after Ayr Number One Conservation Area had been designated in 1969- and came up to date with Patrick Dunne, Ayr Renaissance. A little controversy was aired by the local civic society about a now-cleared development site, and whether the intended replacement preserved or enhanced the character of the Conservation Area, and concern was expressed about Ayr station, soon to come to a head. A walkabout took in the THI, now completed at the bridgehead, all bar one obstinate tenement building, and the rumps of retail shops, all too often closed, that faced the river but will hopefully make a more lively future riverfront.

IHBC visits Maybole as trucks and CARS get underway

A train brought us that afternoon to Maybole, formerly a boot-making town, but that was not to last. Neither would the weather, which became less clement as we heard presentations and then ventured out into the-soon-to-begin CARS. The Maybole Regeneration and Management Plan was presented by Colin Love and Lynne Yuill (South Ayrshire Council) and Wendy Corrigan (Wylie Shanks Architects), to whom we owe thanks. We saw an urban tower house, a former post office, and we debated the merits of linking graveyards of medieval origin to the conservation area.

IHBC and around 15-20 participants are very grateful to South Ayrshire Council and to the speakers who facilitated this fascinating day. Like the April day in Carlops and Penicuik, reported in Branch Newsletter Issue 12, we have learned that Conservation Areas, fifty years on, are still vital tools for managing and enhancing places."

This described the Trust's recent experience in trying to build capacity and unlock repair schemes for Camphill Gate and Walmer Crescent in Glasgow, both with unique issues.
