6.1	Chair (MC). As new to the temporary position, MC asked that we bear with her whilst she settles in. Comment was made regarding the Traditional Training Days arranged by MC. Both events went very well. Demand for the Traditional Mortars event was over-subscribed, such that effort will be made to arrange another, along with the workshop due on 12 February on Plasters & Renders, which is also fully booked. Only 12 spaces were taken for the workshop on window repairs. The workshop on Thatch was deferred to 26 March due to Covid: There are still spaces available for this workshop and the workshop on Timber Structure repairs (12 March). 6.5	Events Secretary (EG) Those organising the events will need to arrange Risk Assessments / Health & Safety etc prior to each event (3 months notice) to ensure we are covered by IHBC Insurance. a) Traditional Building Skills Workshops (MC): See item 6.1. b) Insulation / Retrofit / Climate Change. TB / ARH. ARH not present, but has been talking to Historic England re webinar. Committee were keen for the event to progress during the working day, perhaps 4pm onwards, with a 3 month lead in for publicity (so perhaps a May/June date). Any webinar can be during the week as it seems most members seem to be working from home! Talk to be on most appropriate materials to be used, but also about the issues arising when works are undertaken incorrectly, consequences etc, such as dampness, condensation and associated problems. Too many contractors do not consider buildings holistically!! There are also the issues of undertaking heating & insulation installations whilst avoiding destruction of historic fabric. TB has spoken to Nicholas Heath http://ndmheath.co.uk/about-ndm-heath-ltd/ who does a lot of talks for the Green Register and so might be interested in doing an online talk. It is possible that Nick Heath could join Historic England to discuss these issues: c) Roundtower Lime on Breathable Insulation & Mortars. (email circulated by KK). It was considered that their seminar seems more appropriate for house owners than IHBC professionals, since the basic reasons for Conservation are already known so don't need to be repeated.
